

Autumn recipe Spiced Marrow

this recipe uses marrow but a mixture of other vegetables can be used.

Serves: 3-4

Ingredients

1 Marrow, about 900g	15ml Vegetable Oil
25g Butter	1 Onion, large, chopped
1 Garlic Clove, crushed	15ml Paprika
15ml Flour	150ml Vegetable Stock
10ml Thyme, fresh	15ml Tomato Puree
Seasoning	4 large Tomatoes

Method

Peel the marrow thinly (not necessary for courgette). Cut into 7.5cm pieces, scoop out the seeds then cube the flesh. Heat the oil in a large saucepan, add the onion, stirring on and gently cook. Then add the garlic and cook for 5 mins to soften. Stir in the paprika and flour and cook for 3 mins, stirring all the time. Remove the pan from the heat and gradually stir in the stock and thyme. Bring to the boil and cook until thickened. Stir in the tomato puree and tomatoes and season to taste. Simmer uncovered for 15 mins. Stir in the marrow and cook for 10 mins more, then serve over pasta, rice or baked potato for a simple rustic meal.

Autumn Recipe Chicken Merengo



Ingredients

4 Chicken Joints (or Whole Chicken)
1 Onion finely chopped
200g Tomatoes chopped
35g Cornflour
1 litre boiling Water
100g Mushrooms sliced
2 tbsp Corn Oil
2 Carrots chopped
1 x 125g can Tomato Puree
2 Chicken Stock Cubes
Glass of Sherry

Method

Skin and joint the chicken. Heat corn oil and fry onions. Add the carrots and tomatoes. Continue cooking for about 5 minutes. Stir in tomato puree and cornflour. Mix well. Add stock cubes and water, stir till boiling. Simmer gently for 10 minutes. Rub sauce through sieve, return to pan, add sherry and chicken joints. Cover and simmer gently for about 45 minutes or until chicken is tender. About 15 minutes before end of cooking add mushrooms. Serve with boiled rice.
