

Recipe

Not everyone may celebrate, join in, or agree with Halloween or firework night, but as the days become shorter and cooler an autumn recipe like this cake sounds perfect for everyone at this time of year. Ginger is so warming. I hope you enjoy it.

Gingerbread Swiss roll with Vanilla Frosting



Ingredients
3 medium eggs
100g dark muscovado sugar
100g self-raising flour
2 tbsp ground ginger
Filling
150g butter
300g icing sugar
30ml milk

1 tbsp vanilla extract 100g icing sugar for dusting Method

Preheat your oven to gas mark 4. Line a Swiss roll tin with greaseproof paper. Place the eggs and sugar in a bowl and whisk until thick, pale, and increased in volume. Sift the flour and ginger together into the egg mix and fold through gently with a large metal spoon. Tip the mixture into the lined tin and gently level off. Bake for 8 minutes until just firm. Turn the swiss roll out onto greaseproof paper and carefully peel off the greaseproof paper. Lay a clean tea towel on top of the Swiss roll and carefully roll the sponge up. Leave rolled up to cool completely. Now make the frosting. Place the butter into a bowl and whisk with the milk and vanilla. Gently whisk in the icing sugar until creamy and smooth. Carefully unroll the cooled sponge and spoon over 3/4 of the frosting, spreading it to the edges. Roll the sponge back up but this time without the greaseproof paper in it. Transfer to a serving plate and dust lightly with icing sugar, then pipe swirls of icing along the top and sprinkle with Halloween sprinkles. Serve with a cup of tea for a truly delicious autumnal/Halloween treat.
